DPW has begun collecting leaves from neighborhoods on Monday, November 7. This year, adjustments have been made to the leaf collection program to make it more efficient. Mayor Bowser's Fiscal Year 2023 budget includes funding for 110 additional seasonal positions—a 50% increase over 2022. The collection schedule has also been adjusted to allow leaf collection crews do collections when most leaves have fallen, with residents still receiving two leaf collection pickups. The first pass for leaf collection will occur when leaf accumulation is lighter, for one week in each section. The second pass will be for two weeks in each section when leaf accumulation is heavier. Like previous years, please place your leaves on the curbside or tree box area, raked, on the Sunday before your pass date, which can be found on DPW's website or brochures mailed to houses. Paper bags are optional, but please do not place them in plastic bags or they will end up in landfill. If your leaf collection has been missed, please contact me or DC 311.

You may also bring your old undecorated pumpkins and gourds for composting at Palisades Farmers Market on Sunday mornings.

Balfour Project: Lisa DeBow, PCA Liaison with Trammell Crow Sidewalks, linking the top of 48th place around to MacArthur Blvd, were completed since our last meeting. This is a much welcome addition to the neighborhood and the commercial corridor on that block.

Excavation phase is almost complete, and we will be entering into the concrete pouring phase. Biggest news is that the crane tower will arrive on Friday morning and be installed this Friday and Saturday. One westbound lane of MacArthur Blvd will be closed in front of the Balfour block. Two flagmen will be posted at 48th place and U street to assure the safety of pedestrians.

Guest Speakers: Aaron King from Jon Stover & Associates Heather Gustafson, Palisades Main Street

Aaron King gave a presentation on the market analysis of the Palisades neighborhood conducted in August 2022 (see attachment). Heather gave a presentation on Palisades Main Street.
